#### ABOUT STIG


Stig Lindberg was a Swedish designer and illustrator, renowned for his versatility and playful designs that brought color to the Swedish "folkhem" (people's home). Through his vibrant expression, Stig Lindberg broke away from the traditionally austere Scandinavian design language. He was born in Umeå and educated at the Technical School in Stockholm. In 1937, he began working at the Gustavsberg porcelain factory, where he later became artistic director in 1949.

Stig was a multi-talented artist who worked not only with porcelain but also with textiles, industrial design, and as a children's book illustrator. His works are represented in several museums, including the National Museum in Stockholm and the Röhsska Museum in Gothenburg. During his career, he was awarded numerous accolades, including the Prince Eugen Medal in 1968 and an honorary professorship from the Swedish government in 1970.

Stig made his mark on the international design scene with an exhibition in New York in 1957. In 1959, he gained popularity in Japan through an exhibition at the SEIBU department store and has been celebrated ever since, both in Europe and around the world.

In 2025, a brand-new exhibition of Stig's work will tour Japan, with stops in both Tokyo and Osaka.





#### COTTON & LINEN

About 80% of our products are woven from 100% organic cotton, while the remaining 20% are woven from a blend of 45% linen and 55% cotton. The mix of materials makes it easy for those who buy our textiles to take care of them. They don't require much more than a little bit of love.

To really make it easier for the consumer our textiles go through a chemical process to make them wrinkle-free. The treatment is permanent and does not disappear in the wash. Of course, the process is approved according to GOTS strict criteria for consideration of the environment.

Ekelund was one of the world's first textile companies to be eco-labelled in 1995 with Good Environmental Choice. Since then, environmental thinking has accompanied everything we have done. Everything in our production is organic, GOTS-certified and 100% Swedish-made in Horred.
